Day 1 |Theme: Equity and Inclusion

Webinar Series was inaugurated with the Sarawati Vandana and GTU song on 30/07/2021, 11:00 AM onwards. After Inauguration Dr. Kaushal Bhatt, IQAC-Coordinator & Associate Professor, GSMS-GTU started the webinar by providing Highlights of the webinar series NEP-2020.

On the first day webinar started with the Key Note addressed by Shri. Atulbhai Kothari, National Secretary, Shiksha Sanskriti Utthan Nyas, New Delhi. Dr. K. N. Kher, Registrar, GTU, welcomed the keynote speaker of the webinar and addressed the participant by their deep insights for the University as well as for the Nep-2020 Implementation.

Prof. (Dr.) Navin Sheth, Chairman & Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of GTU, welcomed the Expert of The Webinar and addressed the Participant with their eminent focus and vision with respect to Nation Education Policy- 2020

Moving ahead Shri Kothari shared few insights and his observations regarding the key focus of this NEP - 2020 amongst the participant's i.e.

- Promotion of Local Language by each state in order to promote education at grass root level.
- We shall establish various Institutes such as Engineering, Management, Medical, etc., across rural areas so that students from those area can get access to technical education.
- We shall develop & conduct bridge courses for the special category students.
- Scholarships of reserved category students shall be increased for equally Inclusion
 of them.
- Technical Education has very crucial role to play among the Students, Teachers and Parent.

Considering the key focus areas of these policy, he suggested to formulate the committee for all eight areas of the NEP-2020 which will help in quality enhancement of research. Also evoked to conduct Paper presentation competition among the Teachers, students which results that University will gets good research work.

On the second day of NEP-2020 webinar started with the Key Note addressed by Dr Prof. (Dr.) Shirish Kulkarni, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Sardar Patel University, Vallabh-Vidyanagar, Gujarat.

Dr. Kulkarni began the session describing the recollections of Ancient India and its Success story, and conveyed that the world's best Education is providing by the India, India is known as House of Lords. no one is unemployed here. Opportunities



Dr. Chuhan presented a presentation covering each aspects of the theme, During his presented he first put forward the Indian Skill Report 2020 in parallel to skill report he discusses all the aspects of employability such as Which Domains get more opportunities?, Which sectors hired most?, Supply of human resource within the states, gender bases employability status and course based human resource demand in the economy etc.

He also discussed effect of technical skills as well as soft skills **Entrepreneurship** on Development and **Employability.** concluding remarks Dr. Chauhan highlighted New Education Trends and the Guiarat Technological University (GTU) initiatives with respect to generating Skill, Entrepreneurship Development and Employability amongst its students and stakeholders.

On the fourth day, of NEP-2020 webinar started with the Key Note addressed by the Dr. Krishna Kant Sahu, HOD of Sports Management and coaching at Lakshmibai National Institute of Physical Education, Gwalior. Dr. Sahu hold sound and deep knowledge of sports and related activity, Dr. Sahu shared and highlighted section on Sports and Physical Education part of Our NEP-2020 through his presentation.

Dr. Sahu shared ways to how we can inculcate sport in our academic life with the help of NEP-2020 policy. He conveys that in the NEP-2020 policy, sport is not differentiate but it also becomes a part of holistic education. He states that the research says that 70% of our youth is not fit and healthy with context to sport and Physical education.


Day 4|Theme: Effect of NEP on Youth Empowerment and Sports Development



Multidisciplinary and holistic education are part of the key principles of the NEP. Along with subjects like the sciences and social sciences, the curriculum must contain courses that make education well-rounded, useful and fulfilling, including games, sports and fitness.

- At the school level, the NEP proposes sports-integration, or utilizing physical activities in pedagogical practices, to increase the students' cognitive abilities, while promoting their physical and psychological wellbeing.
- Sports-integrated learning will help students achieve fitness levels
 envisaged in the Fit India movement, and adopt fitness as a lifelong attitude.
 It will also develop their skills like collaboration, self-initiative, teamwork
 and responsibility.

Dr. Sahu shares that he is concerned towards the scenario of our society that children's are moving far and far from the sports and other physical activityHis major focus inclines towards the reforms or we can says suggestions mentioned in the policy document related to sport and Physical education. During his concluding remarks Dr. Sahu requested to all the participants from GTU and especially to the institutes to include sport as a subject of curriculum not an extra curriculum subject and also provide credit points to the students for availing sports as a subject.



Day 5|Theme: Indian Knowledge System, Languages, Arts and Culture

On the fifth day of NEP-2020 webinar started with the Key Note addressed by Dr. Jayendrasinh Jadav, Assistant Professor-GES, Gujarat Commerce College, Ahmedabad. Dr. Jadhav holds sound and deep knowledge of Indian culture, rituals, languages and traditions,

Dr. Jadhay shared his views that how we can add our Indian Knowledge System in our curriculum. He conveys that, the true education is the one who can join human being with life. He says our education system is not as per our need, he believe that as academician it is our responsibility to make our education as per our country demands. Dr. Jadhav says that he is not criticizing the modern education but he puts stress on our epic knowledge. Vedic roots. our Mathematics. Our contribution to the world in the field of education.

Expert shared that the knowledge system of our epic India was too spiritual that the people from outside the country were coming here for getting education. He said that 10,000 + students were enrolled in our Taxsheela Vidhyalay and 5000 + teachers were there to thought the students. How promising ratio of student, teachers it was? He said, we thought our students with respect to Modern Management Principals but we forgot the historical Management Guru who is "Krishana". He evoked Shrimad Bhagvad Geeta in the field of Kurushetra, which show our education is constrains less, we can deliver it even in the battleground. He believes that we have to think local to Global.



Day 6|Theme: Quality Education, Accreditation and Teacher Development

On the sixth day of NEP-2020 webinar started with the Key Note addressed by Dr. S. D. Panchal, Head-IQAC-GTU. Dr. Panchal holds sound and deep knowledge of Technical and Accreditation process.

In the opening remarks, Dr. Panchal conveyed that Quality is the aspect which you cannot determine by the any tool or standards, quality can be incorporate not by the words but by the Act. His presentation completely covers all key aspects of the theme. He favored holistic approach of the policy document, which required flexibility of syllabus and restructuring of Higher Education Institutes.Dr. Panchal appreciated intervention of technology in the Higher Education Institutes which will result in achieving more transparency in the administrative work.

He says Teacher Development should be drive by providing good environment in terms of technical support as well as monetary support too. Also the Continuous Performance Development (CPD) is favored by him and stats that the promotions or appraisal of teachers is not in terms of tenure or seniority based but it shall be in terms of professional achievements and development that once achieved will be considered. He also highlighted the different terminology used in NEP-2020 and provided clear cut definition of those terminology. He also introduced terms like National higher educational regularity, Higher education grant council, general education council etc.

On the seventh day of NEP-2020 webinar started with the Key Note addressed by Dr. C. B. Bhatt, Principal, Government MCA College, Maninagar, Ahmedabad. Dr. Bhatt holds sound **National** and deep knowledge of International Ranking frame work. On this occasion our Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Prof. (Dr.) Navin sheth also joined the webinar and highlighted major stages of ranking frame work and initiated the session.

Expert presented an informative presentation on Research, Innovation and Ranking, in which he provided deep view on Research Ranking and Innovation ranking. 












Day 8|Theme: Use of Technology in Education
